The first floor has a visiting/recreation room, a living room, two bedrooms (one with its own bathroom, a combination kitchen/dining room and an office. The property has mature trees and comfortable seating place in the front. There is no lawn and the backyard has a patio with table and chairs and a barbeque. Are house rules and grievance procedures posted?: Yes No Explain: They are usually posted in the kitchen. They had been taken down in preparation for painting.
What is in place to ensure that these rules and procedures are understood by minors?: Theygo over the rules at the House Meeting that is held every Monday.
Are clothing and possessions inventoried on arrival and departure? How are juvenile's clothing and possessions protected or stored? Possessions are inventoried at arrival and departure and the documentation becomes part of the young woman's file. Some residents arrive with nothing.
